Hi Tony and Amanda (and Scott if you are feeling better),

Further to the conversations between Bryn and Sam Jaffe, we understand that the Offices would like to receive advice on next steps for appointing an individual to the Auckland Light Rail Board who offers a credible voice with mana whenua. That advice was to consider whether we would recommend either Lucy Tukua or s 9(2)(a) for appointment.

Based on our interview of Ms Tukua and a verification check Allan has done \$9(2)(a), \$9(2)(b)(i) , the Ministry recommends Ministers agree to appoint Ms Tukua to the Auckland Light Rail Board. Our rationale is that Ms Tukua does offer significant experiences in both serving as mana whenua and working closely with mana whenua, communities and Treaty Partners to improve outcomes across Tāmaki Makaurau. Her experiences link and are of benefit to ALR and, during her interview, she demonstrated a strong passion for urban design and light rail. (2)(ba)(i)

Can you please let us know whether the offices are still keen for this appointment to go to APH on the 11th, and if so, what the latest possible date for lodgement is? The APH papers can be updated in parallel. We would look to provide what information we have the background checks in advance of the APH meeting.
